Introduction

Centre of English Studies: Who are we?

CES (Centre of English Studies) was established in 1979 and is the oldest language school in Dublin. Over the last 44 years we have won an international reputation as one of the leading English language schools in Ireland, the United Kingdom and Canada. We offer year round language courses for adults and summer language courses for young adults, with students from more than 80 countries around the world. CES is officially recognised by the Irish Department of Education (QQI ACELS) and is a founder member of MEI-RELSA (Marketing English in Ireland / Recognised English Language Schools CES is a full member of IALC Association). (International Association of Language Centres) and EAQUALS (European Association of Quality Language Services). CES has delivered teacher training courses since 2004. During this time, CES has successfully trained more than 2,000 teachers.

What is CELTA?

The University of Cambridge CELTA (Certificate in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages) is the most widely recognised introductory teacher training qualification in EFL teaching in Ireland and internationally.

The CELTA certificate entitles the bearer to teach the English language to non-native speakers both in Ireland and abroad. This certificate is now the benchmark qualification for employment in the quality EFL sector in Ireland and abroad. Due to increased standardisation of English teaching certificates, it is often the minimum requirement for teaching abroad.

We run a 4-week full time course and a 10-week part time course. Our 10-week part time / fully online CELTA course is a very popular one as it gives candidates the opportunity to work on the course as well as managing other daily commitments they may have. All of the modules of the course are done online through a Cambridge Moodle platform with candidates' progress being monitored by an online tutor. All candidates can contact the online tutor with any questions and queries they may have via email, through forum discussions or to meet in a live online chat room. All teaching practice is carried out through Zoom.

Due to its popularity when first introduced last year, we have added another 24-week part time course for 2024. These are fully online courses which are ideal for those with a busy schedule. The two courses will run from 17th January to 26th June and 3rd July to 11th December (with Teaching Practice happening every second week on Wednesday).

This includes all course material, certificate fee and a six-month period of Google Classroom access. If a place is cancelled fewer than 14 days before commencement of the course, the full course feel will be charged. There is a non-refundable deposit of €450 which needs to be paid once one has successfully completed the interview.

Entry Requirements

The minimum age to enrol is 18 although it is generally recommended that you are aged 20 or over. A degree is preferred as some countries require a degree for visa purposes. If you don't have a degree then you should have a standard of education that would allow you entry into higher education. You should have an awareness of language and a competence in both written and spoken English that enables you to follow the course and complete the assignments set throughout the course.

Non-native speakers are required to have a competency level at C1/2 level and certification of this should be provided (e.g. Cambridge Proficiency Exam or IELTS 7.5)

Frequently asked questions

What does the timetable consist of and what is the course content?

The course will cover the following areas:

- Teaching Practice sessions teaching classes of mixed-nationality students at two levels.
- Classroom Observation observation of classes given by experienced teachers (including videos)
- An introduction to E.F.L. information on EFL in Ireland and abroad
- Language Awareness introduction to grammar, syntax and vocabulary
- Lesson Planning
- Authentic Materials using and adapting authentic materials
- Language Skills integration of the four skills
- Methodology and Creative Teaching modern approaches and methodology to language learning
- Classroom Management a focus on group dynamics and teacher / student interaction
- **Error analysis** understanding how learners learn and dealing with mistakes they may make
- Materials Evaluation choosing and adapting course books

What will I be able to do at the end of the course?

By the end of the Celta course at CES, the successful candidate should be able to do the following:

- Plan clearly staged lessons which lead to the achievement of the teaching objectives.
- Effectively implement these lesson plans by teaching classes appropriate to the level and language needs of learners.
- Analyse language for the purpose of teaching and understand basic EFL terminology.
- Evaluate and adapt materials, authentic or otherwise for teaching various aspects of EFL.
- Understand how learners of different nationalities learn and effectively facilitate this process.

How much teaching practice is involved and is it with genuine learners?

On a 120+ hour teacher training course, you need to teach 8 times for a minimum of 360 minutes. Each lesson that you teach will last 45 minutes. The students in the class are all learning English as a foreign language and you will be informed of their level prior to the class so that you can prepare accordingly. Levels taught are Pre-intermediate to Upper Intermediate. Your tutor will be present to monitor the class and give both oral and written feedback after the teaching practice. All teaching practice lessons must be attended.

For the full time face-to-face course, all teaching practices take place within the school with classes of a maximum of 14 students.

Teaching on the part time course (and all online courses) takes place through Zoom online.

Is teaching observation included?

Throughout the course, you will be given the opportunity to observe a minimum of six hours of experienced teachers teaching at a variety of levels. Some of these observations may include watching a video of a teacher in a lesson. You are requited to complete all observations.

How will I be assessed?

You are assessed on two components: your teaching practice and four written assignments. Cambridge has a set of criteria for each component that you must meet in order to get the certificate. Towards the end of the course an external assessor comes in to moderate the course and to ensure that the assessment is being carried out consistently. During the course you will have a minimum of one private tutorial with your tutor at which you will be given an indication of your progress to date.

Do you give career advice?

As there is such a large network of officially recognised schools throughout the country, you have a clear advantage when looking for a job in the quality sector. There are often job opportunities at CES (both in Ireland and in the UK) and we give preferences to our successful trainees. Approximately 70% of our current teaching staff is made up of trainees who have done a teacher training course with CES. The last session on the course focuses on career advice. We also liaise with certain language schools abroad and can assist candidates with working in certain countries such as South Korea, Japan, China, Hungary, Greece, etc.

The course can be a very demanding one with a heavy workload. Although we do have a very high success rate, we cannot guarantee that all candidates will pass. Should you fail the teaching practice component or fail two assignments, you will not be able to pass the course. You will therefore not receive a certificate and cannot receive a refund of fees. Should a candidate withdraw from the course at any stage, there will be no refund of fees. In exceptional circumstances, a candidate may be able to return to complete the course at a future date.

Should a trainee have any questions or difficulties on the course, a member of our training team is always available to speak to and they endeavour to assist where possible.

On receipt of your completed application form, a member of our training team will contact you to arrange an interview. Acceptance on the course is conditional on the applicant successfully passing the interview stage.

If accepted, you will be asked to pay a deposit of €450 to secure your place. This deposit is non-refundable. The balance of the fees should then be made two weeks before the commencement of the course. CES can only hold one's place on the course if payment has been received.

It is CES policy that a minimum of six participants are needed to run a course. There are a maximum of 12 places for the full time face-to face course and 18 places for the part time courses.
